

# 2. Word from the Church Council President

Dear members and friends of St. George's:

Since my last report, so much has happened: Christmas has come and gone, we have had seminars on Preventing Falls and Estate Planning, and we just held our Annual General Meeting. Since many were unable to attend our Annual General Meeting, I would like to share excerpts from my report.

After several challenging years triggered by COVID, I am feeling increasingly hopeful about the future of our church. Highlights for me include our recent Christmas Eve services, which attracted over 170 people – well above the pre-COVID levels of 150; our new and growing number of attendees; the many repairs we were able to make to our church; and most importantly, the kindness and caring for our members who experienced difficult times.

Actions taken to generate more revenue include:

- 1. Claiming HST rebates in 2023, we received \$16,939 in HST rebates for the period January 2020-June 2023 and are now in a place where we will consistently apply for these rebates.
- 2. Increasing rental opportunities we put a sign outside advertising our space and spruced up the interior to make it more attractive to potential tenants. In 2024, we will continue with this work including trying to repair a water leak, repairing ceilings, painting the floors, etc. Once most of this work is done, we will also update our website to include information about rental opportunities at St. George's.
- 3. Monitoring legacies for our Church Karin Schemeit oversees this, but it is a lengthy process.
- 4. Identifying fundraising opportunities we hoped to have a garage sale in front of the church but were unable to do so due to the construction.
- 5. Exploring potential insurance savings we increased our deductible resulting in a 5% savings.
- 6. Exploring Government grant opportunities we received another \$7500 anti-hate and security grant, that we used for a new fence for the repair of the gate and for two motion detector lights.

Actions to better serve our members and grow our church community included, starting a faith group; having more services followed by special events e.g. Preventing falls and Estate Planning seminars; improving our social media presence (thanks to Jacqueline Myers for managing our Instagram account -- please follow us); more outreach events such as garage sales, concerts, an Open-Door event; and sprucing up our building to make it more inviting from the outside. We will also be interviewing interested members and friends of our congregations to obtain their ideas on how we can move forward to reach our goals.

We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of members and friends of St. George's who have stepped forward to help us improve our church and hope that the giving continues. The latest donation has been from the Canadian Baltic Society (Toronto) Inc. which enabled us to replace the lighting in our Fellowship Room. Soon we will paint the floor, so we have a wonderful space to celebrate our upcoming anniversary.

I see 2024 as a pivotal year for us as we carry forward the strong 2023 momentum. It is also an incredibly significant year as we celebrate our 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The fact that St. George's has been a vibrant community for 70 years despite the passing of many of our founding members is an amazing accomplishment. We are planning an incredibly special celebration that will be held in the afternoon.



Please mark your calendars for May 26 and if you would like to help with the preparations, please reach out to Katharina and members of your Church Council. Help is needed to clean the Church well in advance of the celebrations, to find and organize memorabilia, to set up for the event, to prepare food for the event, and to spread the word about our upcoming celebrations so it is well attended.

We are blessed that we are almost seventy years old and still going strong with much to look forward to.

I want to thank you for your love and support of St. George's -- without you, we would not be where we are today.


